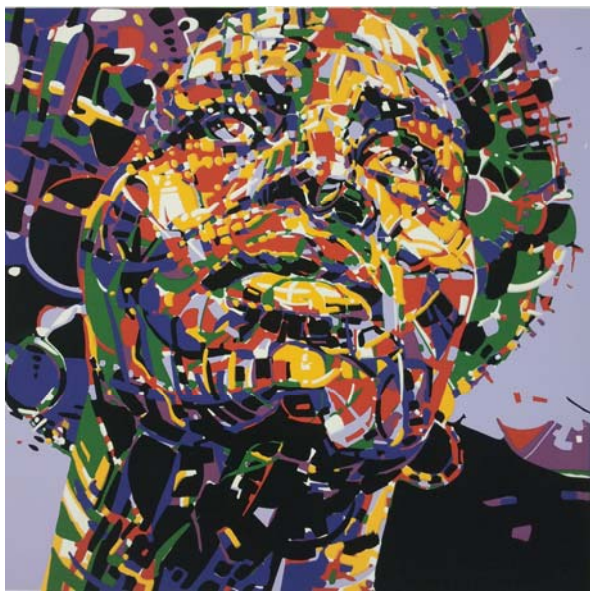


Mixed Media Self Portrait

The self portrait is a way of storytelling or autobiography. It is a way to describe yourself through visual elements. We will begin with a brief discussion of the self portrait in art history and examine how a portrait communicates a personal story. Then we will dive into mixed media materials to tell our own stories. Drawing, painting, found objects, the stars for eyes, heads surrounded by words, many mouths cut from magazines, rivers, mountains, clouds - our imaginations will be ignited!

Louise has been a practicing artist for over 35 years, and has worked in most visual media, including printmaking, photography, installation, encaustic, sculpture and painting. She received a BFA from Northern Illinois University, continuing on to Graduate School of Art at the University of Minnesota. Her work has been show in galleries thought the United States and is in many private collections.
